### Committee Meeting News 16th Nov

The club plans to travel via Skipton where nonwalkers can alight for a feast of festivals and summer activities. We are publishing now to give you time to reserve important 2024 calendar dates. Malham is a popular village in the Yorkshire Dales on the Pennine Way. Its main attractions are the stunning scenery of Malham Cove and Gordale Scar; together with Janet's Foss Waterfall, they are within easy walking distance of the village.

With its famous 900 year old castle, romantic ruined priory and historic cobbled High Street, Skipton is rich both in history and outstanding natural beauty. Many of the town's attractions are linked by the Millennium Walk route, making it easy to navigate around. One can take a short stroll along the Springs Branch canal which runs beneath the castle ramparts into Skipton Woods, watch the world go by relaxing on a Leeds-Liverpool canal cruiser or even pilot their own cruise! Visitors can also jump aboard for an exciting steam train ride! Built in 1888, Embsay and Bolton Abbey Steam Railway is the perfect place to start your journey out into the picturesque Yorkshire Dales.

Journey time from Crewe to Skipton is just shy of two hours; the onward journey time to Malham is about 30 minutes. The coach will park up at Malham in readiness to bring walkers back to Skipton for refreshments before returning home.

The food is excellent, all prepared on site from locally sourced ingredients. 3 course evening meal, cooked breakfast with cereals and toast, and packed lunches. With advanced notification we cater for allergies and intolerances.

We have very knowledgeable local guides and can offer a wide range of walks of varying length and height gain, many straight from the door.

- 2 nights' bed and full breakfast in 5\* en-suite activity accommodation.
- Sat & Sun packed lunches with a variety of sandwich fillings.
- Three course evening meals Fri & Sat.
- Unlimited tea and coffee throughout with homemade cake Friday and Saturday afternoon.
- Licensed honesty bar with selection of wines and beers.
- Local guide who will customise walks to suit . your party and prevailing weather.
- Guided walking Sat & Sun.

Minimum groups size is 15 people (no single room supplements) for arrival after 5pm on Friday, vacating your rooms after breakfast on Sunday.

The fully inclusive 2024 weekend rate is £235 per person (excluding transport).

### Winter Walking Advice

Guidance for walking in colder weather

- Warm clothing (multiple layers provide • improved insulation)
- Waterproof jacket and overtrousers. .
- Waterproof gloves/mittens (mittens are warmer than gloves)
- Warm hat
- Warm drink

- Torch (head torch allows hands free)
- Hand and foot warmers, useful in very cold conditions.

#### How to Dry Walking Boots (BBC Countryfile 19 Oct 23)

Few things are quite as thrilling as waking up on a November morning with the prospect of a refreshing autumn walk ahead. But this feeling of jubilation can quickly dissolve when you discover that your boots are still sodden from your previous day's outing. Next time you'll remember to dry them properly, you tell yourself. But how? Here are some important dos and don'ts...

You will need: shoe brush and newspaper.

Brush off as much dirt as possible from the boots and remove the laces and insole. This may sound



like a faff, but the individual parts will dry more quickly when separated.

Stuff your boots with lightly scrunched balls of newspaper to absorb excess water, replacing the paper every few hours.

Leave your boots in a warm. wellventilated room or outdoors (if it's not raining). Do not put vour boots on the radiator or in front of the fire. The material will dry too quickly and may crack.

Once your boots are dry, re-lace them, insert the insoles and you're ready to go!
